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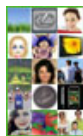

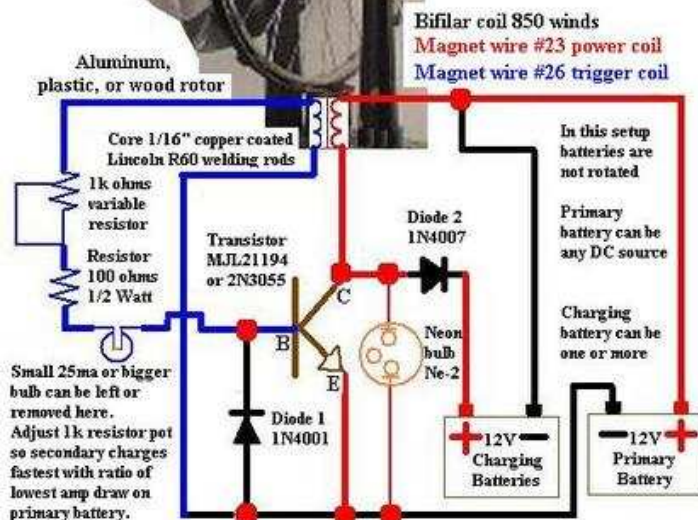

Magnet shape/orientation affect the magnetic field interaction with the coil/core. Narrow magnet means quicker turn on, turn off, desirable to produce sharp
